Hope everyone had a nice Holiday Season with friends and family.


We have entered a new year and it is time to work toward our Specialty in August. If you are willing to help, please contact either Randy or me.

RESCUE REPORT 11/17/2009

Faye and Nellie had vet appointments today. They were judged to be no older than 3. Faye is the easy one, just needs groomed, better nutrition, and the ear wound to heal.

She is heartworm negative and can begin preventative. She's not scheduled yet for spaying until she adjusts better to being here. Don't want too much trauma at once. She's been inoculated for everything now.

Nellie brought tears to the eyes of the first vet and when the second vet entered the room, he staggered backwards for a step.

Her exam revealed no heart or lung problems, and no orthopedic issues. They cut a good 3/4 inch from her nails and we think she will learn to walk normally quickly. We're going to address the nutrition and skin issues first to get her healthy enough to have surgery for spaying and what is believed to be a hernia. Neither vet thought it a tumor as I was afraid. She endured three painful skin scrapings to eliminate a diagnosis of mange. And she's clear of that. Of course ears are inflamed as a side effect of the overall skin condition. She has fur on probably only 30% of her body, the remainder is black, thick, bleeding, oozy, smelly. We also did full blood panel, and her thyroid, kidneys and liver are good. Again, no heartworm. She continued to be very docile during all this, and even gave kisses.

She got a cortisone shot to help her comfort level and we're beginning antibiotics and medicated baths. These dogs are well worth saving. I believe they know their lives are starting to change for the better. No more puppies, no more wire cages, no more minimal food and care.

Thanks to everyone for your continued support for our club's rescue efforts.



January 13, 2010

Faye was spayed, housetrained, and put on some weight before being adopted just before Christmas. She is living with an older male westie now and helping with his weight loss program by regular play times and back yard chasing.

Nellie has come a long way with her socialization and housetraining. She has even adopted some toys as her own. After getting her skin problems under control she was spayed, a growth removed from her ear, and that horrible hernia repaired. Her intestine and some of her uterus were caught up there and you could see how much better she felt when all that was fixed. The medicated baths continue, but she may be done with the oral antibiotics for awhile. Her skin is pink now instead of bare, greasy, smelly black. And there is a light growth of white fuzz. She's comfortable now with the pack here and knows she doesn't have to fight for food and affection. This girl deserves a special home. Please keep her in mind when you talk with people.

In the beginning of December we also helped to find new homes for a young stray female in the Toledo area, and a 10 year old female whose owner had passed away. Thanks for thinking of the rescue fund with your donations.

Here is a pretty common scenario that I thought I would share with you. A dog owner calls a vet or emergency clinic because they think their dog is making some strange choking-type noise. And he is doing it over and over.

They describe some weird noise their dog is making- it's not quite a choke, it's not vomit, it's not a cough and it's not a sneeze. Most dog owners describe it as being more like a sudden and repeated gag. What the dog is actually doing is called a <u>reverse sneeze</u>. It can be normal for some dogs and scary for pet owners that have never seen it.

During a reverse sneeze, your dog will make rapid inspirations, stand still with his elbows spread apart, extend his head, and his eyes may bulge. He'll make a loud snorting sound, which might make you think he has something caught in his throat. Many dog owners think their pet is suffocating during a reverse sneeze episode. Each reverse sneezing occurrence generally lasts for less than a minute up to two minutes.

This can be normal in some dogs but can be abnormal if it occurs a lot.

The vet can give them some medicine to make the reverse sneezing quite down and make the dog more comfortable.
